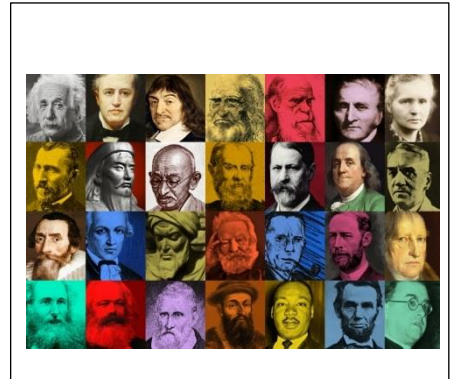

Year 7 overview

Key Stage 3 provides the foundation skills to enable students to study History at the higher levels.

The content covered includes the development of the Church, state and society in Medieval Britain from 1066- 1745 in year 7. At this stage students will start to lay the foundation for the development of imperative skills such as; the basics of essay structuring and the importance of sources to an historian.

Year 9-11 overview

GCSE History follows the new Welsh Board specification.

The purpose of the qualification is to develop a variety of skills and deepen the understanding of the subject for the students. They will develop an appreciation of social, cultural, religious and ethnic diversity and build on their understanding of the past. The aim is that they emerge as effective, independent and resilient learners and as critical and reflective thinkers through a process of historical enquiry.

The specification consists of two topics, each of which is then split into a further two topics.

The component studied for the Britain in Depth topic is The Elizabethan Age and the Non- British topic is Germany in Transition.

- **Written examinations: 2 hours (comprising two papers of 1 hour duration each)**
- **50% of qualification**

The second exam is topics in breadth and the topic studied is the Development of the USA and the thematic study is the Changes in Health and Medicine in Britain.

- **Written examinations: 2 hours (comprising two papers of 45 minutes for the Period Study and one hour fifteen minutes for the Thematic Study)**
- **50% of qualification**
