This is a 1 A level course

Film is offered as a two year course. **IB Film** consists of three modules and is worth an A level. The course is currently all coursework based.

Course Details

AIMS OF THE COURSE include:

- To develop students' skills so that they become adept in both interpreting and making film texts.
- To develop students' understanding of film history, theory and socio-economic background.
- To develop students' critical abilities, enabling them to appreciate the multiplicity of culture and historical perspectives in film.
- To develop the professional and technical skills needed to express themselves creatively in film.

Course Units

IB Part 1:

Textual Analysis (25%). The detailed study of film sequences.

IB Part 2:

Comparative study (25%). Studying two films and film-making traditions from either different countries or dates.

IB Part 3 Creative Process:

Techniques and organization of production (50%). Development of creative, analytical and production skills within film-making.

When?

Start date: September.

Duration: 2 years.

Delivery: Part of a full-time programme.

Availability: Current and continuing.

Who can do it?

Age range: 16 – 19.

SEN target: None.

Entry Requirements: 5 GCSE at grade 4 or above including English and Maths.

Career Information:

You could take this course with other advanced level courses to prepare for higher education in areas of Film or Media, related areas such as Cinematography, Production design, Motion Graphics or more general higher education courses. With further training, you could go into a job related to Media such as a Camera Operator, Editor, Producing, Marketing or Teacher.

The course also helps you develop the skills, understanding and knowledge that many employers across lots of industries are looking for, especially in the economic and financial sectors.
